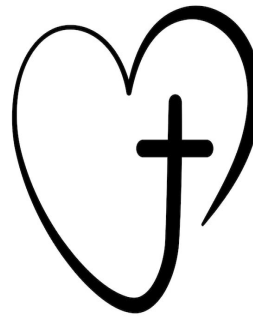

Qué es la Santa Eucaristía?

La Santa Eucaristía es el más importante de los siete sacramentos. La Iglesia Católica enseña que en la Eucaristía, el Señor Jesús, verdadero Dios y verdadero hombre, está realmente presente bajo las apariencias de pan y de vino; su presencia no es simbólica ni depende de la fe de los fieles. Los dos elementos materiales, pan y vino, son completamente transformados en el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Jesucristo, permaneciendo solo sus apariencias sensibles de pan y vino. Así, mediante las palabras de la consagración dichas por el sacerdote, Jesús, sin dejar su presencia natural en el Cielo, también se hace presente sacramentalmente en Cuerpo, Sangre, Alma y Divinidad en las formas consagradas

La Eucaristía es bíblica?

La Eucaristía se menciona muchas veces en las Sagradas Escrituras en su sentido de "acción de gracias" (Sal 9,1; Is 12,1,4; Col 3,17; 1 Tes 5,18). Dar gracias o bendecir a Dios era el elemento esencial de la oración en el templo, la sinagoga y la vida cotidiana de Israel. También Cristo dio gracias a Su Padre por Sus bienes. Esto se dio especialmente en contextos en los que Jesús anticipaba las formas de adoración según la nueva alianza. Por ejemplo, las bodas de Caná (Juan 2), donde cambia el agua en vino; los milagros en los que multiplica los panes (Mt 14,13-21; Mt 15,32-39); la multiplicación de la materia para satisfacer las necesidades de una multitud; y la explicación que Él mismo da de la Eucaristía en el discurso del Pan de Vida (Juan 6).

Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ

Today, on this Solemn Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, we celebrate the fact that our God is so enamored with us, that He allows Himself to become food and drink for our nourishment; that He allows His own Body and Blood to intertwine with our body and blood, so that we can act like Him, talk like Him, perhaps even bear the marks of His Body like Him.

To receive the Body and Blood of Christ in Holy Communion is to receive Love incarnate. To receive the Body and Blood of Christ in Holy Communion is to receive the body of teachings that Christ has passed down to His Church—teachings that challenge us to be counter-cultural, teachings that nourish us in the struggle to be faithful Catholics in an age where every idea is tolerated except the idea that holds to an objective truth that is unchangeable, even when it might not match up with the fleeting trends of the day. To receive Christ in Holy Communion is to receive the commission to do as Christ did, to speak as Christ spoke, to be as Christ was and is.

Love is a powerful thing. It forever intertwines the lives of those with whom it comes into contact. May our lives forever be intertwined with the God of Love, who day in and day out nourishes us with the food from Heaven, which makes our bodies a lovely dwelling place for Him who wants nothing more than for us to live with Him forever in a life of perfect and perpetual Communion.

St. Paul tells us in our second reading that the cup we bless is a participation in the Blood of Christ, and the bread we break is a participation in the Body of Christ. What does this mean to participate in the Body and Blood of Christ? Perhaps it would be easier to discuss what this does not mean: this does not mean that we receive Holy Communion nonchalantly, without truly meditating on the great Mystery of Love that it signifies.
