Domingo de Ramos

Durante la celebración de la liturgia de este Domingo de Ramos, todos nosotros hemos oído las voces que nos llegan a través de los siglos y las generaciones: «¡Hosanna al Hijo de David! ¡Bendito el que viene en el nombre del Señor!» (Mc 11, 9-10). Hemos oído estas voces y las hemos repetido confesando nuestra fe en el Mesías, el Ungido de Dios.

Pero he aquí que de la misma parte del mundo, de la misma ciudad, ante la perspectiva de la Semana Santa nos llegan otras voces y otros gritos que contienen en sí la condena a muerte: «¡Crucifícalo, crucifícalo!» (Jn 19, 6).

Por tanto hoy, mientras en la ora profesamos como siempre que el Verbo se hizo carne y vino a habitar entre nosotros (cf. Jn 1, 14), miramos con grandísimo amor al mismo Verbo que está ante nosotros cual «varón de dolores, conocedor de todos los quebrantos, ante quien se vuelve el rostro» (Is 53, 3). JP II

Easter Candle

“The sun is setting, and our earth will soon be mantled in darkness. The Church has provided a torch, which is to spread its light upon us during the whole of this long vigil. It is of unusual size. It stands alone, and is of a pillar-like form. It is the symbol of Christ . . . When lighted we must see in it both the pillar of fire which guided the people of God, and the glory of our Jesus risen from His grave.”¹ The Easter candle is a constant reminder of His victory, that He is risen.

By around 150 A.D. Christians were holding a vigil before Easter Sunday that lasted until 3 A.M. (cockcrow) at which time they celebrated Eucharist. The vigil began with a lamp or candle being lit in a ceremony known as the Lucernarium (the lighting of the lamp). This ceremony was conducted year round but was more elaborate on the Easter vigil. Many early Christians believed that Jesus would soon return and likely during this vigil. “At midnight, there was a cry, ‘Behold the bridegroom! Come out and meet Him!’” (Matthew 25:6). From the single large candle lit at the beginning of the vigil, candles held by individual worshipers were in turn lit. People spent the night watching, in prayer, and later, administering baptisms.

Liturgy of Baptism

Christians have long administered baptisms during the Easter vigil and the Easter candle plays a central role. It is part of blessing the baptismal waters and lighting the way for the newly baptized. It blesses the baptismal water when it is immersed into the water. “The immersion of the Candle is emblematic of Christ’s descent into the waters of the Jordan, to receive Baptism, and its elevation, of our resurrection, as the effect of the Sacrament, from sin to a life of grace.”¹⁴ Candles given to those just baptized are lit from the Easter candle signifying that these new Christians now possess the light of Christ: “The candle, lit from the Easter candle, signifies that Christ has enlightened the neophytes” (Catechism of the Catholic Church, n. 1243).
