Saint of the Week

Saint Hilary, bishop and doctor (315 – 368)

This staunch defender of the divinity of Christ was a gentle and courteous man, devoted to writing some of the greatest theology on the Trinity, and was like his Master in being labeled a “disturber of the peace.” In a very troubled period in the Church, his holiness was lived out in both scholarship and controversy. He was bishop of Poitiers in France.

Raised a pagan, he was converted to Christianity when he met his God of nature in the Scriptures. His wife was still living when he was chosen, against his will, to be the bishop of Poitiers in France.



Bautismo del Señor

Por qué se bautizó Jesús?

El Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica (párrafo 536) señala,

El bautismo de Jesús es por su parte la aceptación e inauguración de su misión como Siervo doliente. Se deja contar entre los pecadores; es ya "el Cordero de Dios, que quita el pecado del mundo". Anticipa ya el "bautismo" de su muerte sangrienta. viene ya a "cumplir toda justicia", es decir, se somete enteramente a la voluntad de su Padre: por amor acepta el bautismo de muerte para la remisión de nuestros pecados. A esta aceptación responde la voz del Padre que pone toda su complacencia en su Hijo. El Espíritu que Jesús posee en plenitud desde su concepción viene a "posarse" sobre él. De él manará este Espíritu para toda la humanidad. En su bautismo, "se abrieron los cielos" que el pecado de Adán había cerrado; y las aguas fueron santificadas por el descenso de Jesús y del Espíritu como preludio de la nueva creación.

Baptism of the Lord 2026

Pope Benedict brings out the link between the Baptism of Christ and the crucifixion of Christ in a way that's very powerful, and I think worth quoting and reflecting on for just a moment. So this is what Benedict XVI says: Looking at the events in the light of the Cross and Resurrection, the Christian people realized what happened: Jesus loaded the burden of all mankind's guilt upon his shoulders; he bore it down into the depths of the Jordan. He inaugurated his public activity by stepping into the place of sinners. His inaugural gesture is an anticipation of the Cross... The Baptism is an acceptance of death for the sins of humanity, and the voice that calls out "This is my beloved Son" over the baptismal water is an anticipatory reference to the Resurrection. Have you ever wondered that? You should have, because in Matthew, John the Baptist actually asks, "Why are we doing this? I need to be baptized by you, and yet you come to me." And Jesus says: "Let it be so now; for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness." It's not exactly the clearest answer to the question, but He obviously assumes that John is going to understand what He means. So Benedict kind of goes a little further there and explains it by saying...what's happening here is that the reason Jesus has to be baptized, even though He Himself was without sin, is the same reason that He has to go to the cross, even though He Himself is without sin. He steps into the place of sinners by receiving John's Baptism for the forgiveness of sins as an anticipation of the cross on which He will, in fact, take the burden of the sins of humanity upon His own shoulders in order to atone for them. So the Baptism is the ultimate anticipation of Jesus' passion as the suffering servant who atones for the sins of humanity. In other words, Jesus didn't have to be baptized any more than He had to go to the cross.
