

### Saint of the Week

Patron Saint Patrick

**St. Patrick of Ireland is one of the world's most popular saints. He was born in Roman Britain and when he was fourteen or so, he was captured by Irish pirates during a raiding party and taken to Ireland as a slave to herd and tend sheep. At the time, Ireland was a land of Druids and pagans but Patrick turned to God. Patrick arrived in Slane, Ireland on March 25, 433. There are several legends about what happened next, with the most prominent claiming he met the chieftan of one of the druid tribes, who tried to kill him. After an intervention from God, Patrick was able to convert the chieftain and preach the Gospel.**

#### **Pope Leon XIV prayer intention for March:**

For disarmament and peace: Let us pray that nations move toward effective disarmament, particularly nuclear disarmament, and that world leaders choose the path of dialogue and diplomacy instead of violence.

#### **March 19, Solemnity Saint Joseph**

In the West, the oldest reference to the cult of Saint Joseph (Ioseph sponsus Mariae) connected with 19 March appears around the year 800 in the north of France. Thereafter, reference to Joseph, the spouse of Mary, becomes more and more frequent from the 9th to the 14th centuries. In the 12th century, the crusaders built a church in his honor at Nazareth. But it was in the 15th century that the cult of Saint Joseph spread due to the influence of Saint Bernadine of Siena, and especially of Jean Gerson (+ 1420), Chancellor of Notre Dame in Paris, who promoted the cause that a feast to Saint Joseph be officially established.

## Fourth Week of Lent

March 15, 2026



While the blind man in the Gospel lived in darkness all his life, it is those who have sight that fail to see God in front of them. Echoing Paul, it is Christ who will give them light (Cf., Ephesians 5:13). The man was born blind because God wanted to use his infirmity to give them a sign. The disciples, the neighbors, and the Pharisees, on the other hand, could not see. They chose not to see. They preferred the obscurity of their assumptions to the Light of the World. We are no better than them when we choose the darkness of sin.

As we celebrate this Sunday called Laetere, when the Lenten purple is lightened to rose, let us ask for the grace to see — to see ourselves, our faults, our infirmities, but most of all to see and follow the Light of Christ — so that we may “live as children of light” (Ephesians 5:8). “Lord, please let me see!” (Luke 18:41).

#### **Cristo luz del mundo**

Mientras que el ciego del Evangelio vivió toda su vida en la oscuridad, son quienes tienen visión quienes no ven a Dios delante de ellos. Siguiendo con Pablo, es Cristo quien les dará luz (cf., Efesios 5:13). El hombre nació ciego porque Dios quiso usar su debilidad para darles una señal. Los discípulos, los vecinos y los fariseos, en cambio, no podían ver. Eligieron no ver. Preferían la oscuridad de sus falsas ideas a la Luz del Mundo. No somos mejores que ellos cuando elegimos la oscuridad del pecado. Al celebrar este domingo llamado Laetere, cuando la púrpura cuaresmal se cambia a rosa, pidamos la gracia para vernos — para vernos a nosotros mismos, nuestras faltas, nuestras debilidades, pero sobre todo ver y seguir la Luz de Cristo — para que podamos “vivir como hijos e hijas de la luz” (Efesios 5:8). “¡Señor, por favor, déjame ver!” (Lucas 18:41).
